- Strong merits with regards to international research publications is a requirement
- Merits with regards to research dissemination is an advantage
- Merits with regards to external project funding is an advantage
- ARENA's working language is English. Fluent oral and written communication skills in English are therefore required.

  - a) a short presentation of yourself,
  - b) a short presentation of your merits,
  - c) a short presentation of your intended research and
  - d) a short account of why ARENA is of interest to you.
- An outline of your proposed research agenda in the short, medium and longer term. 2500 words maximum (approx. 6 pages), excluding bibliography.
- A CV summarizing your education, previous positions, research experience, administrative experience, and other qualifying activities.
- A complete list of publications.
- Copies of educational certificates (academic transcripts only).
- Copies of what you consider to be your three most important publications to date.
- Names and contact details of two reference persons (name, relation to candidate, e-mail, and phone number). Reference letters are not needed at this stage.

The application with attachments must be submitted in our electronic recruiting system. Please follow the link "apply for this job". Please note that all documents should be in English or a Scandinavian language.
