Språkkrav i kunngjøringsteksten til innstegstillingen

Henvisning til lov- og regelverk

Regler for ansettelse i professorater og førsteamanuensisstillinger ved UiO Forskrift om ansettelse på innstegsvilkår med utfyllende bestemmelser for UiO

Bakgrunn

Det foreslås å legge inn et språkkrav i kunngjøringsteksten til innstegsstillingen. Fra Fakultetet og UiO generelt er det en klar forventning om at alle fast ansatte skal beherske norsk på et visst nivå. Selv om forskning og en del av undervisningen er på engelsk, er norsk UiOs hovedspråk og administrasjonsspråk. Universitetsloven pålegger universitetene et særlig ansvar for å vedlikeholde og videreutvikle norsk fagspråk.

Det foreslås et todelt krav, med krav om deltakelse på kurs i løpet av innstegsperioden, og et krav om ferdigheter på et visst nivå etter to år i fast stilling.

Basert på formuleringer som brukes på Sosialantropologisk institutt og Institutt for Sosiologi og samfunnsgeografi, foreslås følgende formulering:

In a full tenure position, there is a requirement to have sufficient knowledge of a Scandinavian language to be able to participate actively in all the functions the position entails, including administrative tasks. If the candidate hired in the tenure track position does not speak Norwegian or another Scandinavian language, there will be a requirement of passing UiO Norwegian courses as part of the midterm evaluation.

Tenure-track Assistant Professor or Associate Professor in Economics

Job description

The Department of Economics invites applicants for 1-2 tenure-track Assistant Professor (Postdoctoral Fellow) SKO 1352 or Associate Professor position SKO 1011. The opening is for a general research position including teaching and administrative duties. The position is open for all areas in economics and finance.

The appointment is a fulltime position for a period of seven years, including teaching duties and some administration. A formal midway evaluation will be held in the fourth year of the tenure-track period. At the end of the fixed-term period, the candidate will be evaluated for a tenured position according to the Department's criteria, specified in the employment contract.

More about the position

We are looking for a candidate with potential for outstanding research and teaching of high quality. The candidate should have achieved a PhD degree no earlier than 2017 (additional time may be allowed for leave related to childbirth or adoption), or expect to complete a PhD no later than 30 September 2022.

Candidates who has worked in a postdoctoral position for more than one year will be evaluated for a tenure-track Associate Professor position. Successful completion of a doctoral degree is a prerequisite for taking up the position.

The assessment of applicants is based on scientific merits, research potential, teaching, research leadership, administrative experience and personal qualities, as well as the Department's teaching obligations and long-term academic development. Personal suitability will be emphasized.

If the candidate hired in the tenure track position does not speak Norwegian or another Scandinavian language, there will be a requirement of passing UiO Norwegian courses as part of the midterm evaluation.

No one can be appointed for more than one Postdoctoral Fellow period at the University of Oslo.
