

Endringer i Sos 2603 høsten 2022

Eksamensform

Det viktigste spørsmålet å ta stilling til er eksamensform. En av sensorene kom med følgende bemerkning i forbindelse med sensur høsten 2021:

«Dette er en hjemmeeksamen, men oppgavene er typiske for en skoleeksamen, med to kortvarsoppgaver som skal vise pensumoversikt, og en langvarsoppgave som skal vise frem kunnskap og forståelse på et spesifikt tema i pensum.

... Her ligger det vel et grunnleggende spørsmål om hvordan eksamineringen skal foregå hvis ISS skal fortsette å benytte seg av hjemmeeksamener fremover. Hvordan gjør de det i de andre emnene der man har erstattet skoleeksamen med hjemmeeksamen? Kunne man for eksempel benyttet seg av essay-oppgaver, der det er lettere å vurdere hvor mye studentene har skjønt, eller en svært tidsbegrenset multiple choice eksamen?»

Jeg vil også gjerne høre erfaringer med dette fra andre kurs, men tenker at man høsten 2022 må gjøre en endring i eksamensform, enten ved å gå tilbake til skole-eksamen eller endre fra kortvar og et essay til to essay-besvarelser.

Endringer i pensum

Det er en veldig sammensatt studentgruppe som tar kurset, både med hensyn til disiplin og hva slags land de kommer fra. Spesielt den store andelen utenlandsstudenter gjør at man ikke kan forutsette særlig mye bakgrunnskunnskap med hensyn til historie, institusjonelle forhold og aktuelle problemstillinger i arbeidsliv eller velferd. I revisjon av pensum vil jeg derfor legge inn et par kapitler fra Mary Hilsons innføringsbok omkring Norden, da denne nå er tilgjengelig i open access. I tillegg vil jeg redusere kompleksiteten på andre måter f.eks ved å redusere antallet artikler og gjøre kurset noe mer fokusert mht hva slags problemområder som inkluderes. Hvordan dette skal gjøres framgår av vedlagte pensumoversikt med endringer.

Endringer i undervisningsmetoder

De siste to årene har undervisningen foregått digitalt. Når vi går tilbake til fysisk undervisning, som jeg antar vil skje, håper jeg det vil være mulig å aktivere studentene i større grad underveis og dra nytte av den varierte bakgrunn/kompetanse mht disiplin og geografi. Kurset legger vekt på diskusjonen omkring nordisk modell og om det er noe spesielt med Norden sammenlignet med andre samfunn, med utgangspunkt i aktuelle problemstillinger i velferd og arbeid.

Dette opplegget med variert bakgrunn og mer fokuserte problemstillinger gjør at det ligger godt til rette for å engasjere studentene fortløpende. Det er imidlertid klart at antallet studenter og ressurser tilgjengelig setter klare rammer for hva som er mulig. Helst ville jeg sett at det var ressurser til å organisere et seminar tilbud eller infrastruktur for selvorganiserte kollokvier, men hvis ikke så vil jeg i større grad legge inn noen summegrupper og diskusjoner underveis.
