Course Description

It's often difficult to evaluate theories of parliamentary politics or populism using observational data, and it's challenging to run experimental studies with sitting politicians. Instead, scholars can turn to methods of design-based inference or experimental game theory. This module will introduce students to the foundations of behavioral game theory and design-based inference, and illustrate these concepts with a series of applied papers, looking at voters, politicians, and coalition formation in parliaments.

The course will be a mix of lectures and in-class exercises. Readings and slides will be available in advance.
