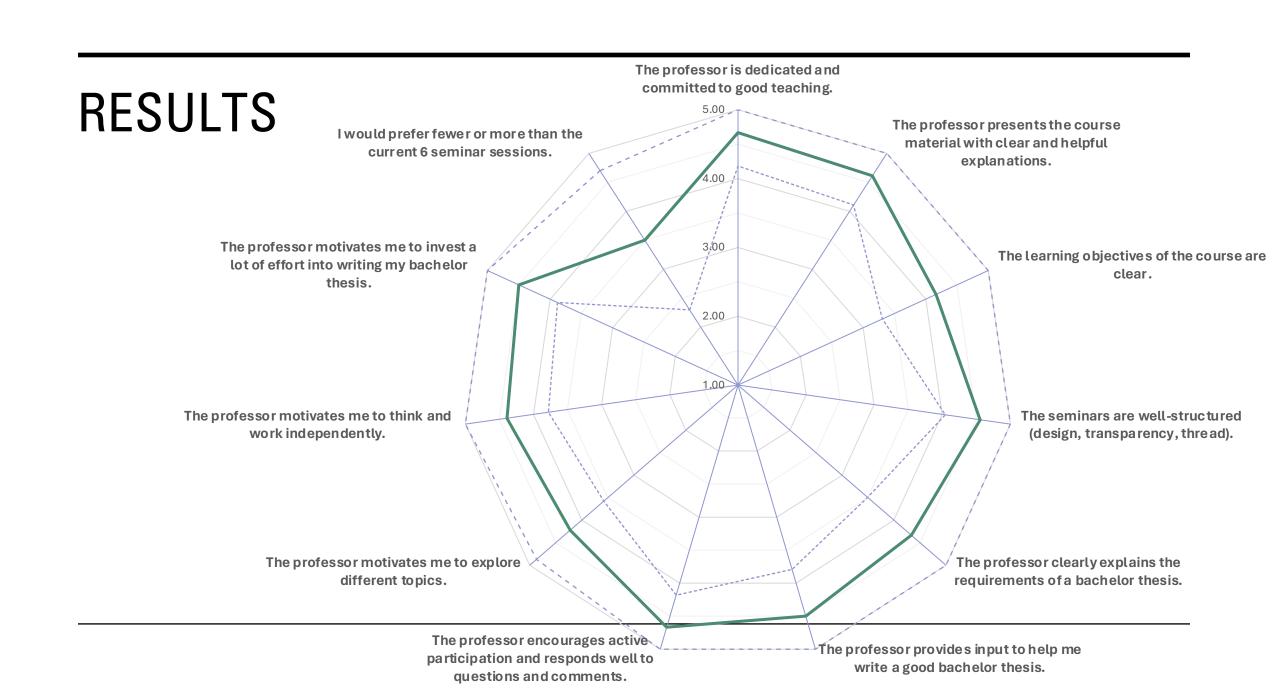


PLAN OF THE COURSE AND EVALUATION

- Seminar teaching:
 - Two parallel seminars of six sessions each (January April).
 - Feedback was collected after session 5 in March.
- Supervision
 - Professors supervise students individually during the course and until the submission of the bachelor thesis at the end of May.
- Evaluation
 - Consisted of 10 quantitative questions and 2 qualitative questions.



LEGEND ETC.

- Green line shows mean value for both seminars.
- Dotted lines show standard deviations.
- Variables were measured on a scale from 1 (strongly disagree) to 5 (strongly agree).
- Except for the preferred number of sessions, which ranged from 4 (=1.00) to 8 (=5.00) sessions. The detailed results show that:
 - 7 students are satisfied with the current 6 sessions.
 - 5 students prefer 7 sessions.
 - 4 students prefer 8 sessions.
 - 2 students prefer 4 sessions.

QUALITATIVE RESULTS

1. What are your favorite aspects of this course?

- Clear structure of the course helps students to progress.
- Gain confidence in my own competences.
- Understanding how to write a thesis.
- Writing on a topic chosen by each student.
- Feedback during supervision.
- Possibility to ask questions and get explanations.

2. What would be your suggestions for potential changes in the future?

- More guidance (even clearer structure)
- More examples of previous theses.
- More focus on the writing process and references.
- Earlier start of the individual supervision (e.g., regarding the thesis topic).

CONCLUSION

- Students are generally satisfied with the course (all mean values between somewhat agree and strongly agree).
- Course guides students effectively.
- Students would like:
 - more rather than fewer sessions,
 - an even clearer structure,
 - more examples of earlier bachelor theses, and
 - an earlier start of individual supervision
